History Corner Moor Pool Avenue 1908

The scene pictured is looking down Moor Pool Avenue towards Park Hill Road. The houses in the centre are at the end of Margaret Grove. Behind can be seen the Harborne Railway line and also the chimney of the Weekin Works. A Steam Roller is puffing away, maybe either hauling materials or rolling the road surface. A horse and cart are parked just behind. On the left are a group of workmen. The setts at the edge of the road are in place but piles of materials lie distributed around. Gas lights are already in place in the verges. Somewhat incongruously, 3 ladies in their finery are walking up the pavement on the right accompanied by a child. Perhaps Mrs Nettlefold with one of their children on an inspection visit? Who knows. At the time the temporary Estate Office was at the last house on the left.

There is a suggestion curtains are in the properties but no chimney pots. Would houses be occupied without a working fireplace at the time?

Above the roofs of the houses on the left can be seen the top of a property on Westfield Road. All this of course before trees enveloped the bank of the railway


