

Verge Repairs

The pressure has been kept up on the Council and the contractors to get the verges properly repaired where work has been done. You may also have seen that some reseeded of the verges has been done by residents at the bottom of Margaret Grove. We need the contractors to fulfil their legal requirement to reinstate and the battle to get that done goes on.

If there is damage outside your house caused by large vehicles or delivery vans you may have to make some repairs yourself and in fact if it is accused by your contractors it is your responsibility. We are advised that stones should not be put on the verges and any sticks put in to protect must be well set back from the edge.

Who knew that the law and regulations about verges was so detailed and complex?


